Ghost by Jason Reynolds
When finished with the book, complete the one-pager assignment (see attached template) to demonstrate an understanding of story elements and comprehension of the book. A one-pager combines drawings, images, and words to represent a literary work.

Once school begins, students will review the books with guided questions and activities about their selected book and take an objective quiz to check understanding of the book and its story elements. The summer reading quiz and one-pager will be averaged and count as a test grade.

The one-pager assignment should include the following :

- In the border, write the title and author of book. Also put your name (first and last name). Any white space should be filled with key words, doodles, etc. that relate to the book.
- In the upper left corner, draw a picture or provide an image of the main character(s). You should include the names and brief character description as well (a few words to tell who they are or what they are like.
- In the upper right hand corner, draw a picture or use key words to describe the point of view (1st or 3rd person) of the book. Provide a definition of that point of view in that space as well.
- In the middle, write an important quotation from the book and provide the page number(s) on which it appears.
- In the lower left corner, draw a picture, provide an image to represent the setting of the book. Put keywords that tell where and when the main action of the story takes place.
- In the lower right corner, draw a picture or provide an image to illustrate a conflict (internal or external problem) that exists in the book. In one brief sentence say what the main problem in the story is.

The one-pager assignment will be graded based on the following criteria:

- All required elements are included.
- The project reflects the student's understanding of the book.
- The student's work is colorful and neat.
